

Covid-19 Latest Updates

CDC will provide updated information as it becomes available, in addition to updated guidance.

CDC continues to respond to the global outbreak of COVID-19 and preparing for the potential of community spread and resurgence in the United States.

North Carolina is still in Phase 2 of re-opening. This means that you are "safer at home". This is not being enforced by law enforcement officers, which is allowing for people to hit the road. This is not recommended.

Recommendations for all North Carolina residents is to keep abreast of your home county requirements, mandates and/or restrictions. Be diligent and pay attention to daily news releases.

Before you travel, know the status of where you are going! It would be sad to travel from home to (for example) Myrtle Beach only to learn that you must quarantine for 14 days upon your return home.

Or if you are traveling from North Carolina to New York, New Jersey or Connecticut you must quarantine for 14-days upon arrival. Know before you go.

Practice the 3 W's: Wear a mask; Wash your hands and Wait 6 feet apart!

We will get passed this pandemic if everyone does their part to keep our communities safer and makes a real effort to stop COVID-19 spread.





WHAT TO LOOK FOR: IS YOUR LOVED ONE A VICTIM OF ELDER FRAUD?

Suddenly befriending a stranger and spending substantial amounts of time with this new "friend"

Noticeable decrease in contact with family members or friends

Creation of new bank accounts or opening new credit cards

Excessive increase in charges for caregiving costs

Regularly being asked for money by a friend or caregiver Frequently spending money on items that are not needed or seem out of character for the senior to purchase







As the number of people and communities affected by the COVID-19 pandemic grows, so do the scams associated with it. Scammers use public health emergencies as opportunities for new fraud schemes, and because older adults are at greater risk for serious illness from COVID-19, they may target older populations.

There is currently no FDA-approved vaccine for COVID-19 and although there may be treatments for symptoms, there is no "cure." However, scammers often use fear-based tactics to convince people that a vaccine or cure is now being offered.

It's also important to remember that although the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and other public health officials may contact you if they believe you may have been exposed to the virus, they will not need to ask you for insurance or financial information.

The Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) recommends that Medicare beneficiaries:

Contact your own doctor if you are experiencing potential symptoms of COVID-19.

Do not give out your Medicare number, Social Security number, or personal information in response to unsolicited calls, texts, emails, home visits, or booths at health fairs and other public venues. If your personal information is compromised, it may be used in other fraud schemes as well.

Be suspicious of anyone going door-to-door to offer free coronavirus or COVID-19 testing, supplies, or treatments.

Carefully review your Medicare Summary Notice (MSN) or Explanation of Benefits (EOB), looking for errors or claims for products or services that weren't received.

Follow the instructions of your state or local government for other actions you should be taking in response to COVID-19.

Contact your local SMP for help. SMPs empower and assist Medicare beneficiaries, their families, and caregivers to prevent, detect, and report health care fraud, errors, and abuse.

The Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) is ready to provide you with the information you need to PROTECT yourself from Medicare fraud, errors, and abuse; DETECT potential fraud, errors, and abuse; and REPORT your concerns. SMPs help educate and empower Medicare beneficiaries in the fight against health care fraud. Your SMP can help you with your questions, concerns, or complaints about potential fraud and abuse issues. 
We also cheered up our drive-thru meal recipients by staying in character until all of the meals were served!
