"5 Minute Challenge"


Each newsletter cycle, a prompt will be sent to you via email requesting that you complete the following 4 steps:

Davidson County Senior Services had our annual yard sale!


This year we also hosted a coffee truck and had a bake sale! Totaling over \$600 for the yard sale spots and baked goods.
